Hiring of David Frasca - part time Police Officer

Officer Frasca is retired from the Ontario County Sheriff's Department and continues to work part time for the Village of Phelps. Officer Frasca has 35 years of experience and Chief Upchurch recommends the Village consider hiring him as a part time officer. WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Clifton Springs, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interest of the Village of Clifton Springs to adopt said Local Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Clifton Springs hereby adopts said Local Law No. 2 of 2016, entitled, "A Local Law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c", a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of this resolution, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk be and she hereby is directed to enter said Local Law in the minutes of this meeting and in the Local Law Book of the Village of Clifton Springs, and to give due notice of the adoption of said local law to the Secretary of State of New York.

Local Law No. 2 of the year 2016

A local law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c Be it enacted by the Village Board Village of Clifton Springs as follows:

Section 1: Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Village of Clifton Springs, County of Ontario pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Village of Clifton Springs to adopt a village budget for (a) village purposes (b) fire protection districts and fire departments and (c) any other special or improvement district governed by the village board for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 2017 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 2: Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes the village board to override the tax levy limit by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of the village board.

Section 3: Tax Levy Limit Override

The Village Board of the Village of Clifton Springs, County of Ontario, is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 2017 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the limit specified in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 4: Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5: Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

STREET DEPARTMENT: Trustee Kumkey reported the following:

Kendall Street

The crew has been busy installing sidewalks and other miscellaneous work to significantly improve Kendall Street from West Main Street to Stephens Street. Much of the area got dug up during the recent water line project and the Board agreed that now would be the time to improve that section of the street with new sidewalks and to mill and repave the street. This improvement has taken time to complete the job correctly.

Debris pick up

Trustee Kumkey is concerned that recently a resident put a whole street out for debris pick up. The Village newsletter's indicates that the Village does not pick up whole trees. Trustee Kumkey is concerned because of the equipment it takes to haul away a whole tree and the manpower. Discussion was held on whether or not the street department should pick up whole trees in the future and all Board members present agreed that the Village will not pick up whole trees. Whole tree removal or large tree debris removal will be the responsibility of the homeowner.

Solar Power

The instillation of the two solar arrays on Village property is well underway. Mayor Hunter recommends the Board members go and take a look at the arrays, Mayor Hunter states the arrays look amazing.

CLERK REALS REPORT: Clerk Reals was not present but provided the Board with the justice court report, copies of zoning violation letters, payroll worksheets, the fire department report for June and July and year to date numbers thru June, July and August along with the bank statements for June, July and August.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Railroad Corridor

Trustee Linsner asked for clarification on the Railroad Corridor and the lot that the Village does not want included in the corridor. The Board discussed the corridor and explained the lot that is not to be included is a vacant piece of property owned by Beverly Rodman, the lot is located between 66 West Main Street and 70 West Main Street. The Village has notified the Town and the County in writing that the lot needs to be removed from the corridor in order for the Village to be agreeable with the corridor study.

Registrar Appointments

A letter from NYS Department of Health regarding the appointments of the Registrar and Deputy Registrar. Lori A. Reals was appointed Registrar and Linda A. Rider was appointed Deputy Registrar at the annual organization meeting on April 11, 2016. Clerk Reals will notify DOH of these appointments.
